What you are most looking forward to for your July trip to Uganda?



The festivals that we host in both June and July allow our partner schools the chance to compete with one another, focus a bit on our annual theme, and prepare for the country's MDD competitions that happen in late July across Uganda.

In a nation that loves football, their passion for the musical arts comes in a very close second position. Each school is allowed to bring 50 students to compete in the festival in five different events. They each prepared a poem, an instrumental piece, an original composition, a folk dance, and a traditional dance. We were humbled by the talent and

passion of the staff and students in Gulu last month, and we cannot wait for the 26th of July to cheer on our students in Wakiso.
